



Famous Extraverts and Introverts by Brightest Color

The purpose of this handout is to help facilitate group discussions during the Brightening portion of the Personal Success Seminar. Facilitators can enhance the quality of their seminars by educating participants on the importance of recognizing whether someone is an extravert or an introvert and understanding the difference it makes in how we show our True Colors.

Extraverts have a tendency to show their True Colors more outwardly because they express it openly to the world. Introverts, on the other hand, have a tendency to keep their primary color to themselves. As a result, introverts tend to show their second color more openly to the world. Listed below are examples of well-known extraverts and introverts by color style and can be used to help illustrate how these concepts all tie together.
